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THE BPIF ARE PROUD TO ANNOUNCE THE LAUNCH OF THE 2023 BRITISH BOOK DESIGN AND PRODUCTION AWARDS AND FOR THE FIRST TIME, THE AWARDS WILL INCLUDE NEW CATEGORIES FOR SUSTAINABLE AND INNOVATIVE BOOKS ALONG WITH 17 FURTHER CATEGORIES.

As one of the most prestigious and popular literary events of the year, the awards recognise and promote the excellence of the British book design and production industry by celebrating the best books of the year. These include everything from Best Jacket / Cover Design to Educational Books.

With a total of 19 exciting categories and a great line-up of judges, start thinking about what categories you can enter today!

ENTRY GUIDELINES

The entry guidelines require that the entries must be published, designed, typeset, printed or bound by the entrant in the UK, with the exception for the Best British Book, Innovative and Sustainable categories, which can only be entered with books produced entirely in the UK.

You may enter a title into more than one category and a separate copy of the book must be submitted for each category entered. You must provide a written submission and a copy of the book for the Innovative and Self-Published Books categories (maximum 300 words).

JUDGING PROCESS

The judges will be looking for exceptional design, free of typographical errors, with particular emphasis given to excellent layout and standards of typography. The judges reserve the right to move books into another category if it seems appropriate.

DEADLINES

All books published from **1 July 2022 until 7 July 2023** are eligible for entry in this year's awards.

The deadline for entries is Friday 7 July 2023

2022 BOOK OF THE YEAR

JUDGES' COMMENTS

The judges thought *Where Excellence is Elevated:* 50 Hudson Yards stood out from all the other fantastic entries this year. The book conveys a high standard of finishing, with a stunning combination of creative design and print production. A delight on the eyes, and a joy to hold making this a worthy overall winner.



CATEGORIES

| BEST BRITISH BOOK

Exemplifying the highest standards of book design, production and printing, this category is open only to books that are published, printed and bound in the UK and should serve as a celebration of the British Print Industry.

| BEST STUDENT BOOK

This category is open to anyone studying in full or part-time education on a recognised publishing, printing or design-based course within the UK and Ireland (there is no entry fee for this category). Please note that a signed letter from the student's course professor must be included with the entry stating course, college and course dates. The winner of the award will be given the opportunity to have some work experience with either a designer, publisher or printer and also a cheque for £500 along with the trophy that will be presented at the awards evening.

| FINE BINDING & LIMITED EDITION

Entries in this category should be a binding of excellent standard of craftmanship, alongside concept and design innovation. This category showcases the skills and fine detail applied to the book-binders art. Limited Edition is defined as a book with a print run of less than 1000 copies.

BRAND / SERIES IDENTITY

A minimum of four books needs to be submitted for this category with at least one book published in the relevant year. Each book should reflect and promote the series whilst extending the value of the 'collection.'

SELF-PUBLISHED BOOKS

A chance to celebrate and congratulate authors who have worked tirelessly to create their own 'story', by sourcing their own means and resources to design, print and publish. Entries are welcome for every subject area, provided by a 300 word entry evidencing selfpromotion is accompanied on application.

EXHIBITION CATALOGUES

These need to have been produced to the highest standards of print quality, with fully documented entries and illustrations.

| PHOTOGRAPHIC BOOKS

These need to have been produced to the highest standards of print quality photos.

ART / ARCHITECTURE MONOGRAPHS

This category is suitable for the highest quality of image reproduction that should create something visually stunning for the high-end market.



| TRADE ILLUSTRATED

General non-fiction featuring a combination of illustrations and text that informs and educates the reader.

| LIFESTYLE ILLUSTRATED

Living and lifestyle activities e.g. cooking, DIY, gardening, with particular attention being given to consistently high standards of design and production.

| LITERATURE

Fiction, poetry, biography and letters - both hardback and paperback.

| EDUCATIONAL BOOKS

This applies to educational books produced for schools, colleges and universities. The ability to capture and retain the readers' attention is important in this category.

SCHOLARLY, ACADEMIC & REFERENCE BOOKS

For example atlases, research studies, should include clean designs, exceptional finishing and can be complimented with photography.

| CHILDREN'S TRADE

All children's literature entered in age categories 0-8 and 9-16. One winner will be chosen from each age category.

| BEST JACKET / COVER DESIGN

Full colour or monochrome book jackets. Attention should be given to the visual impact, creativity and design.

| GRAPHIC NOVELS

A graphic novel is a book made up of comic style content. This includes fiction, non-fiction, and anthologised work which we hope will reflect the changing trends in the UK books industry.

NEW: INNOVATIVE BOOKS

Provide up to 300 word summary of why you think the book is innovative and what process was used to produce the book. This category is only open to books that are published, printed and bound in the UK.

NEW: SUSTAINABLE BOOKS

Entries in this category must demonstrate the levels of sustainability the book has achieved, from materials to production process. Entries can be supported by providing a written submission up to 300 words. This category is only open to books that are published, printed and bound in the UK.

BOOK OF THE YEAR

This will be selected from the winners of the other categories.
